

# Grab-N-Go! Knot

## Materials

- 2 ~ Size 15" x 7-1/2" Rectangles Of Cotton Fabric {For Tie}
- 2 ~ Size 7" x 7-1/2" Rectangles Of Cotton Fabric {For Tie Lining}
- Sewing Thread To Match Or Contrast With Cotton Fabric

## Directions . . . See Grab-N-Go! Knot Assembly Diagram

*Note: This is a fun accessory compliments and attaches to the tag-a-long quilt in our Blue Skies & Rosy Cheeks Pattern No. 2010128. As baby begins to crawl and toddle make and sew this simple grab-n-go knot to a corner of the quilt so baby can grab-the-knot-n-go! For convenience, hang the quilt on a hook when not in use.*

**Step 1:** To make the lined base of the knot for quilt front, pin right sides together and sew (1/4" seam) a knot rectangle to a knot base lining rectangle on three sides (up a 7" long side, across the 7-1/2" across the width and down a 7" side). Clip corners at an angle to remove bulk. Turn right side out & press. Repeat this step and make a second one for the quilt back. Top-stitch 1/8" in from edges on 3 sides.

**Step 2:** To make the knot, begin with right sides together, and pin knot front to knot back. Sew (1/4" seam) them together on three sides, beginning and ending at the stitching that was done in step 1 (sew down an 8" long side, across the 7-1/2" width and up an 8" long side). Clip corners at an angle to remove bulk. Turn right side out and press. Top-stitch 1/8" in from edges on 3 sides.

**Step 3:** The Grab-N-Go! knot is complete and ready to attach to the mini quilt. Pick one corner of the mini quilt and using the angled quilt stitching on the quilt border as a guide, pin (thru all layers) the lined bases of the Grab-N-Go! Knot at an angle to the quilt corner, sandwiching the quilt between the lined base front and lined base back. Using the top stitching as a guide, stitch thru all layers, the lined bases to the quilt. Tie the end into a pleasing knot.
